MEET KARLA, DASF'S NEW EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT & PROGRAMS MANAGER



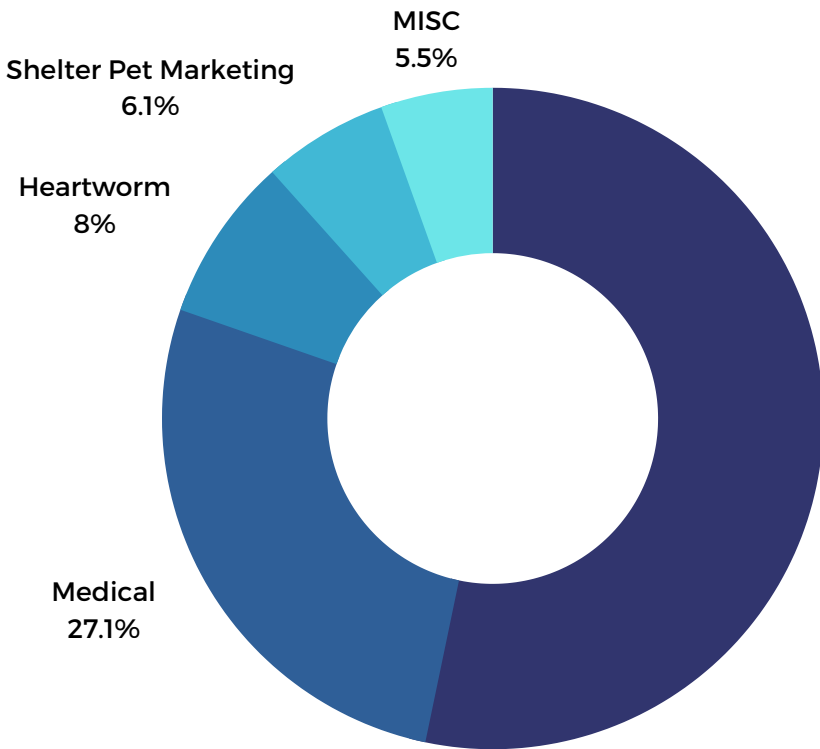

SHELTER SUPPORT STORY: MOCHA



Denton Animal Shelter management contacted DASF at the end of October 2021 asking for assistance with an emergency medical case. Mocha was brought into the shelter after being hit by a car. The shelter and DASF partnered to save him. He had extensive surgery to repair his broken pelvis and shattered leg. After several months in foster care, Mocha was able to be neutered at the end of January along with his microchip and updated vaccines. He was released from crate confinement. Mocha was adopted and found his forever home! He lives with a retired couple and his new furry sister Ginny – and we are told that he is sleeping on their bed!

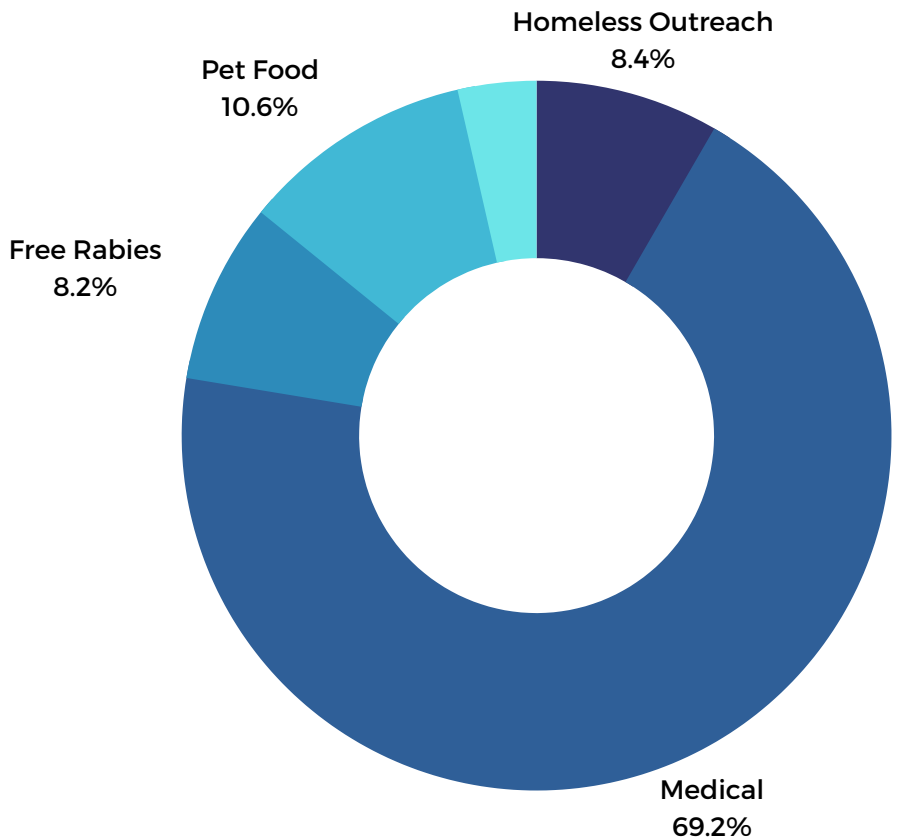

In 2022, Giving Hope Inc/Grace Like Rain, Our Daily Bread/Monsignor King Outreach Center, Denton Animal Support Foundation, City of Denton Animal Services, COD Police Department, COD Homeless Outreach Department organized an outreach team to assist those experiencing homelessness with their pets.

In late May, DASF sponsored a FREE rabies vaccine clinic for the pets of those experiencing homelessness at Monsignor King Outreach Center/Our Daily Bread. Vaccines were administered by TCAP for 12 dogs and 4 cats!

DASF also provided pet food, leashes, treats and toys for the pets. Thank you to everyone who donated to the initiative and/or shopped our Amazon Wish List!

HOMELESS OUTREACH



THE SHELTER ENDOWMENT FUND - A LEGACY OF LOVE



The fund, established in October 2015 continues to attract new donors who wish to create a Legacy of Love for the Denton shelter pets. The fund provides on-going financial support for the Linda McNatt Animal Care & Adoption Center in perpetuity.

Donations are restricted and maintained separately from other DASF operating funds. The money is managed by an independent professional investment firm, Cultivar Capital Inc; and is closely overseen by the DASF Board of Directors and Endowment Committee.

Grants are given to the shelter upon request of shelter management once approved by the DASF Board. Generally distributions are made from interest earned while the bulk of the principal remains intact to generate future revenue for grants.

Through 2022, approximately \$41,000 has been given to the shelter in endowment grants alone. These funds have been used for pet adoption programs, facility upgrades and special equipment.

SHELTER ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE WELCOMES NEW MEMBER

Rosemary Grose was newly appointed to the Endowment Committee in 2022. She has served as a DASF volunteer and on the DASF Board for 14 years. She is a major DASF donor of time and treasure. She has also volunteered significant time at the Denton shelter.



SHELTER SUPPORT STORY: MOTHER TERESSA

Mother Teresa ended up at the shelter very pregnant. The next day she gave birth to 9 beautiful babies. A shelter is no place for this little family and they were desperately seeking a rescue. DASF offered a \$500 veterinary voucher plus a voucher for a free spay to any rescue who would pull Mother Teresa and her 9 puppies. Mother Teresa and her puppies were rescued by in the The Love Pit and eventually adopted out by loving families.



COMMUNITY SUPPORT STORY: FRANKLIN (MILITARY SERVICE DOG)

The Denton County Veteran Services Office contacted DASF about a veteran's service dog who was run over by a car in November 2021. DASF has worked with the veteran to get Franklin the veterinary care he desperately needed. Until fully healed Franklin was unable to provide his "duties" which caused his veteran owner severe stress. DASF paid for 10 rounds of laser therapy, pain medications, and anti-inflammatories as well as a CT scan of Franklin's spine. The veterinarian reported a slight fracture in Franklin's spine, but surgery was not recommended. During December and January, Franklin continued laser therapy, medications and crate rest. By the end of January, Franklin was cleared to begin re-training for his return to normal life. It has been a long journey. He still has a spine injury; but has healed enough to overcome almost all of his disability and can resume normal activity.

The owner is extremely grateful to DASF and donors for their continuous support.

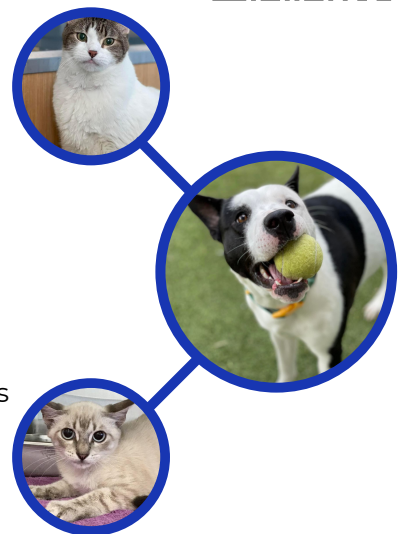

EMERGENCY MEDICAL FUNDS AT WORK

SHELTER SUPPORT STORY: OZZY

DASF was contacted by Denton Animal Shelter Management about a cat the shelter veterinarian had been treating for a skin issue that they were having trouble resolving. Ozzy came to us in December 2021 and he was adopted in January 2022. Fast forward to April 2022 when this amazing boy was left in a storage unit in very bad condition. DASF agreed to assist with additional veterinary expenses and medications. After a few weeks of TLC, Ozzy's skin was clear and he was cleared for adoption!

Not long after, he was adopted by a loving family!



COMMUNITY SUPPORT STORY: AMETHYST

DASF was contacted in mid January about a puppy who was at the emergency room. Amethyst ate a sock and was sent home after the ER was unsuccessful in getting the puppy to vomit the sock back up. The owner was told the puppy would pass it on her own, but the sock did not pass and instead caused a foreign body blockage in her small intestine. The owner's regular veterinarian was unable to perform the emergency surgery due to short staffing so the owner took Amethyst to the ER in Frisco who performed the surgery. DASF collected donations as well as donated \$1,000 towards the emergency surgery.

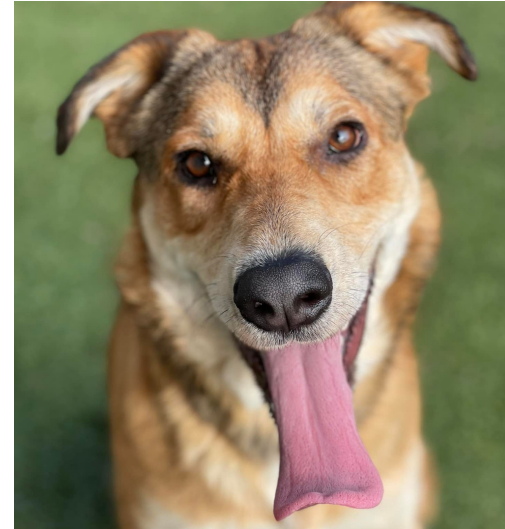
